## About ESHS-S

East Stroudsburg High School–South is a comprehensive public school servicing grades 9-12 with satellite services from the Monroe County Area Vocational-Technical School. This school is accredited by the Pennsylvania Department of Education. The high school is also the local testing center for the Scholastic Assessment Testing Program sponsored by The College Board. The school runs on a two semester, block scheduling pattern. Most full credit courses run for 90 minutes per class period. Final grades are reported each semester.

The school district is located in Pennsylvania’s beautiful Pocono Mountains incorporating the Monroe and Pike Counties. The school district includes the borough of East Stroudsburg and its university, which enrolls both undergraduate and graduate students. Also located within the district boundaries is the Pocono Medical Center, along with a number of resorts including Shawnee, Mountain Manor, Caesars, and Fernwood. This area serves as a recreational retreat for the New York and Philadelphia metropolitan areas. East Stroudsburg is a fast-growing school district with students from diverse social, cultural, and economic backgrounds.

## Curriculum

Among the college preparatory curricula, honors level courses are available in all areas of instruction. Advanced Placement courses are available in Calculus, English, U.S. History, Government, Chemistry and Biology. Gifted and accelerated students may take part in the Honors Seminar program. Elective courses are available in required subject areas (English, math, history, science), and are also available in foreign languages (Spanish, German, and French), business, art, vocal and instrumental music, family and consumer science, and technical education. Students in grades 10-12 have an additional opportunity to enroll in one of the 23 half-day programs at the Monroe County Career & Technical Institute. Opportunities for independent study in a given curriculum are also available upon approval of a faculty member and the principal.

## Class Rank

Rank in class is computed at the end of each marking period. It includes all subjects except driver training. Class rank is cumulative throughout the high school years, and compares all students regardless of curriculum. Students are ranked at the applied level on the basis of 4.0 scale. They receive a 4.0 for an “A”, 3.0 for a “B”, 2.0 for a “C”, 1.0 for a “D”, and 0.0 for an “F”. College Preparatory courses are weighted with a multiplier of 1.25; honors courses are weighted with a multiplier of 1.375 and advanced placement courses are weighted with a multiplier of 1.5. Each percentage point earned within the grading scale increases the quality point value awarded.

For transfer students, credits earned in their previous district carry no weight. Therefore, their rank and GPA are determined solely by their performance at East Stroudsburg High School-South.
