## The Lehman Intermediate School agrees to implement the following:

- The school will put into operation programs, activities and procedures for the involvement of parents in the
  Title I, Part A program. These programs, activities and procedures will be planned and operated with

- The school will develop school-parent compacts annually and this will be shared with parents during the first marking period.
- The school will identify barriers to greater participation by parents (with particular attention to parents who are
  economically disadvantaged, are disabled, have limited English proficiency, have limited literacy, or are
  of any racial or ethnic minority background). The school will use the findings of the evaluation about its
  parental involvement policy and activities to design strategies for more effective parental involvement, and to
  revise, if necessary (and with the involvement of parents) its parental involvement policies.
- Title I funds may be used to pay reasonable and necessary expenses associated with parent involvement activities, to enable parents to participate in school-related meetings and training sessions.
- The school will provide materials and training to help parents work with their children to improve their children's academic achievement. Parent newsletters will go home with students (Fall, Winter, Spring) to update parents on school matters and a school website will be maintained containing information regarding school programs and offerings. (Activities for summer reading will be distributed at the end of the school year.)
- The school will ensure that information is sent to parents in an understandable format and, to the extent practicable, in a language the parents can understand.
- The school will provide assistance to parents in understanding topics such as the following:
  - PA Academic Standards;
  - o PSSA (Pennsylvania System of School Assessment);
  - District Assessments;
  - Title I requirements;
  - How to monitor their children's progress via ProgressBook;
  - How to work in partnership with the school;
- The school will conduct an annual evaluation of the content and effectiveness of this parent involvement policy via a parent survey.
